



HISTORY OF SHELTER NOVA SCOTIA

1968The Saint Leonard's Society of Nova Scotia established
1984 <u>Sir Sanford Fleming House</u> , a halfway house for men, opens in Halifax
1993Turn Around Point Services, a halfway house for men, opens in New Minas
2000Women's halfway house opened in the basement of Sir Sanford Fleming House
2001 <u>Barry House</u> , a shelter for women experiencing homelessness, opens in Halifax
2005 <u>Nehiley House</u> , a women's halfway house, opens in Halifax
2007Turn Around Point Services closes in New Minas
2009 <u>Metro Turning Point</u> , a shelter for men experiencing homelessness, merges with Saint
Leonard's Society
2010 <u>Supportive Housing</u> program initiated
2011Saint Leonard's Society of Nova Scotia reinvents itself as Shelter Nova Scotia
2012 <u>The Rebuilding</u> , a 19-unit affordable, supportive apartment complex opens
2015Shelter Nova Scotia opens it's 6th facility, known as Herring Cove Apartments
